In January 2018, the flu season hit its peak, becoming the most widespread in over a decade. Hospitals needed quick and adaptable solutions as they faced increased patient numbers and staff illnesses. Knowing the typical 13-week travel nursing assignments wouldn't keep up with the sudden and unpredictable rise in demand, several hospitals turned to Fastaff Travel Nursing for their Rapid Response® services.

Some notable examples include:

- 1. A large central California hospital requested 10 ICU/telemetry nurses for two-week assignments due to uncertain flu-driven patient numbers. Fastaff provided all 10 nurses within 48 hours and assigned a senior staff member to handle logistics and transportation. At the end of the two weeks, and with census still high, all 10 nurses were offered extensions.
- 2. A 400-bed acute care hospital in Orange County, California, urgently needed 20 ICU nurses for two weeks, and Fastaff ensured their arrival within 48 hours.
- 3. A renowned tertiary care center in Tucson, Arizona, needed 32 ICU, telemetry and ED nurses with immediate start dates; Fastaff answered the call. The nurses not only arrived prepared but also willingly supported other units with full flu coverage.
